Job description and required qualifications:

The appointed associate professor is required to conduct research on analyzing and evaluating

the relationship between land use and landslide risk by integrating concepts from various

research fields, such as geology, geomorphology, geoinformatics, geophysics, and related fields.

The candidate is expected to develop methods to create detailed landslide disaster risk

information for government agencies, local authorities, and the general public, and to develop

methods to immediately disseminate the landslide disaster risk information. Moreover, the

candidate is expected to conduct research in collaboration with relevant practitioners to

enhance the societal implementation of developed methods. In addition, the candidate will

have responsibility for education in the Division of Earth and Planetary Sciences, Graduate

School of Science, Kyoto University. The candidate must hold a Ph.D. or equivalent degree,

have practical experience in landslide disaster management, and be proficient in Japanese.
