Job description and required qualifications:

The appointed professor is required to conduct the development of exploration methods and

research for investigating the physical property information of slopes by integrating concepts

from various research fields such as geology, geomorphology, and exploration geophysics. The

candidate is expected to enhance the research aimed at clarifying the distribution and regional

characteristics of landslides both in Japan and abroad by utilizing visualization and modeling

techniques of slope structures, to establish high-precision landslide disaster risk information,

and develop methods for immediate dissemination of risk information, taking into

consideration changes in nature and society. Moreover, the candidate is expected to foster

international dissemination of the information technology for risk information. In addition,

the candidate will have responsibility for education in the Division of Earth and Planetary

Sciences, Graduate School of Science, Kyoto University. The candidate must hold a Ph.D. or

equivalent degree, have long-term research and/or practical experience outside of Japan, and

be able to use Japanese on a daily basis.
