The Faculty Consort of Disaster Prevention Research, Kyoto University invites applications for a permanent Associate Professor position.

**Location:** Shirahama Oceanographic Observatory, Research Center for Fluvial and Coastal Disasters, Disaster Prevention Research Institute, Kyoto University

**Job description and required qualification:** The appointed associate professor is requested to be engaged in research at the Disaster Prevention Research Institute (DPRI) on typhoon disasters, wind disasters, storm surge and wave disasters as well as the fundamental research relating to these disasters, such as the interaction between atmospheric circulation and ocean current and the mechanism of local heavy rainfall. He/she works at the Shirahama Oceanographic Observatory\*, and also manages the operation of the Shionomisaki Wind Effect Laboratory\*. He/she is expected to popularize disaster prevention education and to dispatch information on disaster prevention. He/she is expected to contribute to education in the Graduate School of Science or the Graduate School of Engineering, Kyoto University. He/she should have a Ph.D. or its equivalent and be proficient in Japanese.

\* The Shirahama Oceanographic Observatory and the Shionomisaki Wind Effect Laboratory (address: 3349-134, Shionomisaki, Kushimoto-cho, Higashimuro-gun, Wakayama 649-3502, Japan) are operated as one group named "Shirahama Research Base" since 2009.

**Starting date:** As soon as possible after the selection.

**Working conditions:** Working hours: 38 hours 45 minutes per week under full-time employment in a discretionary working system. Days off: Saturdays, Sundays, public holidays, Year-end and New Year holidays, University Foundation Day, and summer vacation.
